The Council is very worried about NHS problems in Oxfordshire. The Radcliffe has a huge deficit and the Primary Care Trusts are still being reorganised. Government plans to free up beds will mean people being released earlier (possibly too early) and being placed in the community with aftercare provided by Social Services. However, the Government's social services grant to The Council has been cut! The situation is becoming impossible.

You may have heard something about Local Government re-organisation in the news recently. David Miliband proposes to ask Local Authorities if they wish to become Unitary Authorities. Oxfordshire currently has two-tier Local Government: five District Councils and the County Council.

The Council's policy for de-cluttering roads of The Districts deliver about 20% of services signs has gone down well with the people of including waste collection, benefits, planning Oxfordshire and will begin with The High in and licensing and the County does everything the centre of Oxford. If you have any burning else, including schools, social services and fire desire to get rid of some road clutter, please let services. The suggestion is that we have a single Council covering all services. My own view is that while Unitary Authorities make sense and would be less confusing, the cost of the change would be astronomical. There would also be an issue about representation. At the moment a District Councillor represents around 1,700 electors and a County Councillor about 5,000. So if we went unitary the number represented by a single councillor would increase. The topic will be addressed by a Government White Paper from Ruth Kelly's department (C&LGD) in the autumn and the Lyons Report on local government finance in December, so I will keep you informed later in the year or early next year.
