PARISH COUNCIL DEVELOPS LOCAL EMERGENCY PLAN

Oxfordshire County Council and the Vale of the White Horse District Council have Emergency Plans which detail the action to be taken following a major accident, extensive flooding or loss of essential services to a significant area. An emergency plan covers any situation which would stretch the resources of any of the emergency service agencies and provides for co-operation between the police, fire and rescue service, electrical supply companies etc.

Charney Bassett is included in these emergency plans and would benefit if the village was affected by a wider area disaster. Priority would be given to those most affected by problems and this may mean that the village had to wait its turn if it was less severely affected than some other areas. Locally some help may be available sooner rather than waiting for stretched official resources.

To assist in the organisation of this local intervention, the Parish Council decided to publish the Charney Bassett Emergency Plan. The Plan covers advice on appropriate action, how to obtain information on the developing situation and who to contact so that the appropriate people are aware that help is needed in Charney. The plan will be made available on the Village website.

DENCHWORTH RESIDENT WARNS - "I DONT THINK I'M GULLIBLE BUT I NEARLY FELL FOR IT."

"Chap phoned – number withheld – said he was from 'card security' wanted to check a recent charge to one of my cards - £800 – 15minutes ago – please could I confirm. No I said I've not made a purchase – fraud he said. I asked which card – said he couldn't say for security reasons – I said I wasn't comfortable, felt there was something wrong with the call – he said don't worry I don't want any details from you – have you got a card from Halifax etc etc. Yes I said – he said there's a phone number on the card please ring it immediately and report it. So I hung up and was just about to ring the number.

Thank goodness my wife is a radio 4 addict – stop she said, this is a scam – he hasn't rung off, no matter what you dial the call goes back to him, you think you've got card security on the line; give him all the card details and they've got you!. Sure enough there was no dial tone!

I think I'm pretty savvy but I damn near fell for it. I have to say the chap was very convincing! So please be on your guard."
