### LOGS FOR LABOUR IS ON AGAIN!

## **NEWS FROM THE FARINGDON EAST NEIGHBOURHOOD ACTION GROUP**

**Speedwatch will go live this month**. The mobile equipment jointly purchased by eight local Parish Councils (including Charney Bassett) has now been delivered. It will be available for use in Charney Bassett on a regular basis.

Eleven local volunteers have received police training and seven sites approved as suitable for undertaking speed checks as part of an educational initiative.

**Monthly update from the Neighbourhood Policing Team**. The latest update has been posted on the Charney Bassett Website.

**Budget cuts ahead?** Thames Valley Police is likely to be subject to further budget cuts. It is hoped existing staffing levels in this area will be retained. Even so, their workload is likely to increase significantly as the population of the area rises.

**Police Community Support Officers.** Thames Valley Police are reviewing their role. They are the ears and eyes of the Neighbourhood Policing Team, giving reassurance at grass roots level.

If you know of a vulnerable person who would welcome a visit from the Police please let them know. If you suspect lads may be supplying young girls with alcohol or drugs please do not hesitate to let them know.

**Borderless Policing.** Increased emphasis is being placed on cross boundary cooperation and joint working to make better use of resources and counter rural crime.

**Role of the Neighbourhood Action Group.** For more information on the role of the Group visit the Charney Bassett Website.

#### **VOLUNTEERS WANTED - CAN YOU HELP?**

Charney Bassett Parish Council is currently developing an Emergency Plan (EP). This is a document which lists contact details of where assistance may be obtained and gives an outline plan of action so that those involved do not have to think for themselves in the confusion of an emergency. An emergency may be due to flooding, bad weather, blocked roads, loss of electrical supply, water supply, fire, accident.

Updating of the EP will be reviewed annually but where changes are identified during the year immediate updates can be issued – eg where someone moves away from the village or is no longer able to supply equipment or help (due to health, work or other commitments).

This is not merely bureaucracy: the reason for planning is to provide one source of information in the event of a crisis. Emergency services contacts are recorded elsewhere but in an emergency it can be stressful to search for this information. The availability of equipment and helping hands locally is not usually recorded and whereas villagers may have this knowledge, Police/Fire and Rescue services and OCC/VoWHDC staff may not. The aim is to provide alternatives to cover holidays and other absences.

The EP needs to list individuals who may be able to turn out in the event of an emergency and the skills and equipment which they can provide eg:

First aid training - Water pump - Electrical generator - Off road vehicle - Chainsaw - Axe - Trailer-Winch and any other equipment which may be useful.

The document can be changed at any time if the information is no longer relevant or is incorrect. The first approach in any incident will be for the emergency services concerned to deal with it themselves BUT sometimes there may be a delay if resources are stretched and some secondary support may be useful. Nobody will be asked to exceed their capabilities and training or be expected to place themselves in danger.
