

FROM THE VILLAGE RECORDS

Thirty five years ago

Nominations for the Parish Council exceeded the number of Councillors permitted and Charney Bassett held its first (and only) election at a cost £2 per household.

Twenty five years ago

The Parish Clerk was asked to convey the Parish Council's outrage at a proposal to build an international airport on a green field site near the village.

Ten Years ago

A villager had reported that there were strange holes in the vicinity of the play equipment which could be evidence of rats. The Vale Pest Control Officer had visited the site and advised that the culprits were short-tailed field voles which do not present the health hazard associated with rats and there is nothing he can do to remove them. They like water and they eat grass and bark, which may account for them venturing into the play area to eat the protective surface.

YOUR VIEWS ON COMMUNICATIONS IN CHARNEY

Last month households who receive the Charney Chatter by e-mail were surveyed on their current use of Chatter and the Charney Bassett Website. The results show a very positive response to the move to electronic delivery and a high level of satisfaction with Charney Chatter and the Website.

In the great majority of Charney households at least two people are reading Chatter on their computers or tablets with very few finding it necessary to print it out. Overall reach of the electronic version was 97%.

All the comments made about Chatter in the survey were positive. About a quarter of the comments were suggestions about additional content or additional ways that Chatter could be used.

E-mail updates between issues of Chatter were almost universally popular with 95% saying that they were useful and had appropriate content. The comments made supported the current type of e-mail update and the topics covered.

Overall usage of the Charney Bassett website has significantly increased over the last year. The survey showed that much of this increase has been driven by the presence of "links" in Charney Chatter, and that these increased both the number of website users and the number of times users went to the website.

- 3. Enter details of the problem
- 4. Confirm the report and Oxfordshire County Council will investigate
- 5. Track progress
