FROM THE THAMES VALLEY POLICE

Thames Valley Police is calling on friends and family to help tackle the problem of Courier fraud by taking ten minutes to talk to elderly friends and relatives.

Courier fraudsters phone and trick victims into handing large sums of cash to a courier that arrives at their home.

To beat this, officers have created prompt cards that can be pinned next to the front door and put next to the phone to explain to vulnerable and elderly people how to recognise courier fraud, and to stop them from becoming a victim.

AND OTHER NEW CONWATCH OUT FOR BOGUS WEBSITES ADVERTISING ELECTRICAL GOODS AND DOMESTIC APPLIANCES

Fraudsters are setting up high specification websites advertising various electrical goods and domestic appliances. These goods are below market value and do not exist. The website will state you can pay via card; however when the purchaser goes to pay, this option is not available and the payment must be made via bank transfer.

The fraudster entices the purchaser and reassures them it is a legitimate purchase by using the widely recognised Trusted Shop Trustmark. They then use the Trustmark fraudulently and provide a link on the bogus electrical website to another bogus website (which purports to be Trusted Shops). This website shows a fake certificate purporting to be from Trusted Shops and provides thousands of reviews for the bogus electrical website. These reviews are all fraudulent. The website has not been certified by Trusted Shops and therefore the purchaser is not covered by the Trusted Shop money-back guarantee.

Protect yourself:

- Check the authenticity of the website before making any purchases. Conduct a 'Whois' search
 on the website which will identify when the website has been created. Be wary of newly formed
 domains. You can conduct this search using the following website https://who.is/
- Conduct online research in relation to the website, company name and the business address provided to identify any poor feedback or possible irregularities.
- Check the Trusted Shops Facebook page where warnings about websites using their Trustmark are published. If you are in doubt about the legitimacy of a Trustmark then you can contact Trusted Shops on 0203 364 5906 or by email service@trustedshops.co.uk. They will confirm whether they have certified that website.
- Payments made via bank transfer are not protected should you not receive the item. Therefore
 always try to make the payment via PayPal or a credit card where you have some payment
 cover should you not receive your product.
- If the item advertised seems too good to be true, then it probably is.

As part of their research into the history of Charney Bassett, The Charney History Group would be interested to know of any historical objects that you might have found in your garden. These might be:

Worked flint - Coins - Potsherds - Old bottles etc



e.g. this is a picture of a potsherd found in a garden in Charney. It comes from a bottle or flagon probably made in Cologne or Frechen, around 1500 – 1700 AD. A great deal of this pottery was imported to England in the seventeenth century, as was the white wine of the region.

If you haven't found anything then keep a special look out when you're digging the garden this spring, you never know. If you have a modern house you may still have history in your garden.

IS ALEXANDER THE GREAT DEPICTED IN OUR CHURCH?

In an article by Christopher Howse in the Daily Telegraph on Saturday 6th February 2016, he refers to

"A semi-circular carved stone, a tympanum that used to sit above the south door. It is 900 years old and carved in a vigorous style associated with Herefordshire, most notably at Kilpeck. Here at Charney Bassett (once in Berkshire, but now conquered by Oxfordshire) the tympanum shows a man standing between two beasts.



A hurried glance on an overcast day might take him for Daniel in the lions' den. But wings grow from the shoulders of the beasts, which grip with beaked jaws the upper arms of the man between them. They are clearly griffins. He nevertheless stands resolutely with his hands round their necks. Perhaps he is Alexander the Great"......
