IMPORTANT SAFETY NOTICE REGARDING RAIL ELECTRIFICATION

From **27**th **May 2016** the overhead lines and associated infrastructure along the Great Western Route should be treated as "live" at all times.

You do not need to touch the wires to receive a shock. It is extremely dangerous and only trained and qualified train personnel are permitted on the track or any associated part of it, including supporting masts, cables and other elements. There is of course no danger to any persons provided they remain away from the railway boundary and fencing altogether.

CHARNEY BASSETT WATER MILL OPEN SUNDAY MAY 15th 2-5pm



On National Mills Weekend Charney Mill will be open on Sunday afternoon May 15th.

The mill is leased by Charney Bassett Parish Council from Oxfordshire County Council.

Inside the building the milling machinery is complete having been conserved and renovated by a loyal group of volunteers. The mill race now has just a small flow of water, sometimes none, to help prevent flooding in the bottom end of Charney Village. The mill therefore lacks water to power the carefully renovated machinery and the millwheel stands still. The Mill has all sorts of interesting and historical things displayed inside such as grinding stones from other mills and records of their work in conserving this fascinating building. There is also a display of tools from Manor Farm when it was a working dairy farm in the middle of the village.

Purse bells are a great way to alert the owner that someone maybe trying to remove their purse from their bag, due to the "bell" noise it makes.

The UV pens are a great way to property mark smaller electrical items.

The personal alarms are a great way to feel safer when out and about, it reaches 130dBs, is key ring activated, and has an LED torch.
