

VILLAGE DEFIBRILLATOR FUND CHEQUERS INN RAISES £1450+

A glorious afternoon, a full house and generous support from villagers and customers alike was just reward for all the preparatory work undertaken by TEAM CHEQUERS (Jackie, Ian, staff, relations and friends)

Cakes were brought and sold, cream teas devoured, raffle tickets snapped up, auction bids made and bags of loose change donated - all in a relaxed community atmosphere.

Thanks also to those who made donations or provided cakes and raffle prizes. We are delighted to announce that the amount raised is very close to £1500, including approximately £300 from loose change collected in the bottle and bucket on the bar." Our target has been met and surplus funds will be placed in a ring fenced account held by the Parish Council. Maintenance and servicing of the unit will be suitably covered, and any other worthy cause required by the village will be considered.

Further discussions have been held with Julie Ingram-Johnson and it has been agreed that the proceeds of the forthcoming Patchwork and Quilting Exhibition will be added to this account. Our special thanks to Julie for donating the exquisite quilt which raised a lot of money in the silent auction held on the 'cream tea afternoon'.

Advice is being sought from the South Central Ambulance Service NHS Trust to see if the provision of other health related equipment in the village might be appropriate. Fund raising organisers will be consulted should any suggestions come forward for consideration.

AND THE NEXT STEPS

Action is being taken to complete the renovation of the telephone box, prior to installation of the defibrillator unit.

Households will be provided with information on what to do if a cardiac arrest is suspected.

Whilst the defibrillator can be used by untrained persons via automated user instructions provided in spoken and visual format, residents are strongly advised to take advantage of free awareness sessions which will be provided in the near future. These will also cover CPR 'hands on' techniques. Dates to be announced shortly

KEEPING OUR VILLAGES SAFE

LATEST CRIME FIGURES

Thames Valley Police have released crime figures for 2013/14 which show that the South Oxfordshire/Vale of White Horse area is the second best performing local police area in the Thames Valley. In the twelve months under review crime has been further reduced and the number of offenders brought to justice increased

Superintendent Andy Boyd points out that whilst the figures show only a modest decrease in crime last year this has to be viewed in the context of a 38% reduction in the last ten years. He believes the overwhelming majority of the public in this area have trust and confidence in the Police and this relationship has contributed to a sustained reduction in crime levels.

He praises the work of local <u>Neighbourhood Watch</u> and <u>Neighbourhood Action</u> Groups and promises continued support in the year ahead.

WANT TO KNOW MORE ABOUT CRIME IN CHARNEY BASSETT AND THE SURROUNDING VILLAGES?

Go to www.police.uk enter the word 'Faringdon' under 'Find Your Neighbourhood' and explore the map. You will find there were 95 reported crimes in the Faringdon area in February 2014

Further investigation provides a detailed breakdown of the number and type of crime for the villages' e.g.

Charney Bassett area 3
Lyford area 1
Southmoor area 7
Hinton Waldrist area 7
Littleworth area 4
Hanney area 2

Crime figures vary from month to month and care must be taken not to draw firm conclusions from the statistics quoted above
