THANK YOU FROM HELEN ROYAN AND DIANE EWART

A huge thank you to everyone who came to the meeting to learn about options for the new playpark equipment last Saturday or who submitted their views via email. There were some fantastic ideas and very impressive designs from some of our younger residents. We really appreciated all the comments and suggestions and have reviewed them all.

In summary you have requested that:-

The main play structure should contain a slide, climbing wall, wobbly bridge, monkey bars, fireman's pole and include some sort of platform. It is envisioned that this structure would be aimed at the 5 plus age group.

Ideally the 0-5 year age group should have a smaller climbing structure with a slide. In addition you really like the idea of having a car/boat/train/house for smaller children to indulge in imaginative play as well as a roundabout or 'springee' (a ride on vehicle or animal on a large spring).

A chalkboard and an outside safety mirror could be attached to the existing fencing.

Other ideas for outside of the fenced off play area were:-

A table tennis table, assault course, football nets, a concrete base for the basketball hoop, gym equipment and seats in the willow structure.

A zip wire which was an overwhelming hit with most the positive comments.

Taking comments, safety and maintenance into consideration we have decided against a sandpit, cinder track, sensory garden and trampoline so apologies to those of you who championed these.

What next?

Diane and I will formulate proposals based on the above and obtain quotes.
