Village Community-led Plan - Update from Road Safety Group:

Terms of reference for the Group have now been approved by the Parish Council

A detailed paper covering a wide range of options has been drafted for consideration by the Parish Council at its May meeting and as a basis for future discussions with Oxfordshire County Council.

Consultation will take place with villagers once practicable options have been identified.

And in the meantime householders are reminded to:

- cut back vegetation where it causes an obstruction or undue narrowing of footways;
- use the 'Fixmystreet' website to report potholes etc.

We are very fortunate that the Parish Records from 1617 to 1974 were brought together in a beautiful book, in the mid-seventies. The records were transcribed by Elizabeth Blizzard and a number of copies were made.

Subsequently the Oxfordshire Family History Society scanned the contents of the book on to a CD in pdf format.
