PLEASE SHARE THIS MESSAGE WITH ELDERLY FAMILY AND FRIENDS

On Wednesday (22/3) an incident occurred at The Kestrels, Grove, Wantage.

The victim, an elderly man, was approached by two other men who claimed to be police officers.

They asked the victim for his phone number and then instructed him to return home and await a phone call. A witness later saw the same men leave the scene in a large silver car.

The victim was subsequently called by someone claiming to be an officer from the Metropolitan Police. The caller warned him that a fraud was taking place on his account and that he needed to attend his bank and move £25,000 into a different account number that the caller provided. The victim attended his bank in Didcot where thankfully the fraud was prevented by bank staff who identified that there was a crime taking place.

Thames Valley Police are reminding members of the public that the police will never contact you in person or by telephone to ask you to withdraw money from your bank account, or to transfer funds into other bank accounts.

The two men who pretended to be police officers were believed to be using a silver car, possibly a Vauxhall Vectra. A witness described the two men as being of Asian appearance.

DISTRACTION BURGLARY - CRIME REDUCTION ADVICE

A distraction burglary is when someone turns up unannounced with the intention of tricking their way into your home. They may pose as officials or ask your help with something.

Some work alone, but they often work in groups of two or more, usually with one person knocking at your door with a convincing excuse. They keep you occupied whilst often sneak in and search your house to steal cash and valuables.

There are some steps you can take to keep yourself safe:

- If you are not sure who is at your door do not open it.
- Check the ID of the caller by calling the company they say they work for i.e. gas electricity water or police.
- Use telephone numbers listed in the directory NOT numbers provided by the caller.
- Don't keep large quantities of cash at home.
 Reputable companies will not insist to be paid in cash.
- Keep windows and doors secure at all times.
- Use a door chain.
- If you suspect a bogus caller has visited you call the police on 101.
- Please look after and advise elderly family members and neighbours.

A genuine caller with happily wait outside while you check on them by calling their organisation and/or calling a family member or neighbour.

Finally please remember this type of crime is not common but we must all remain vigilant!

CHARNEY BASSETT PARISH COUNCIL APPROVE TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE ROAD SAFETY WORKING GROUP

The Road Safety Working Group is an ad-hoc advisory group of village volunteers. The Parish Council is represented by the Chairman David Roberts.

The purpose of the Group is to:-

- 1. Address road safety concerns identified in the Charney Bassett Community-Led Plan.
- 2. Liaise with and seek advice from Oxfordshire County Council.
- 3. Secure up to date views from all sections of the community and identify -
- (a) any potential low cost safety initiatives/ improvements which have general community support and can be implemented without formal County Council approval
- (b) if there is a consensus of opinion in support of safety measures which would require formal County Council approval. If so undertake research, scope, and investigate sources of funding and consult further with the local community.
- 4. Report progress to the bi-monthly meetings of the Parish Council.

You can sign up to Thames Valley Alert via email, text, or even receive voice messages about what's happening in your local area.

The service is completely tailored to you, so you can choose what sort of alerts you would like to receive – whether you'd like news on local incidents, community news, or you'd just like to be alerted to significant or high priority messages. When you sign up to Thames Valley Alert (a free service) you will be given login details that will allow you to change your settings at any time. 
Have you ever spotted a date stone on a house in Charney Bassett? Where, and what date does it show?
