NEWS FROM THE JANUARY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

ROAD SAFETY The recent Traffic Volume and Speed Survey has added weight to village concerns over road safety.

Residents are to be asked for their ideas on improving road safety and for their views on a series of measures suggested by the Road Safety Working Group. It is unlikely the County Council will provide any funding.

Consultation will be via a special edition of Charney Chatter and a public meeting which will held in the Village Hall in March or April.



PRECEPT The Vale of White Horse District Council has been advised the Parish Council wishes to increase the precept for 2018/19 from £4100 to £4500.

PLANNING Concern was expressed at an application for change of use of a barn to dwelling on land east of Minmere bungalow, Buckland Road.

THE OLD SCHOOL Oxfordshire Buildings Trust is to consider if there are ways to help rescue the Old School House in New Road from its present derelict appearance.

GRASS VERGES The Parish Council is to explore taking over responsibility for cutting highway grass verges via a Service Level Agreement with the County Council

<u>CHARNEY MILL</u> Consideration is being given to the need for some renovation work being undertaken at Charney Mill



TRANSPARENCY CODE A grant of £915 has been obtained to help the Parish Council comply with the requirements of the Government's Transparency Code.

<u>VILLAGE WEBSITE</u> The village website is to be moved on to an improved and more flexible web platform.

<u>CHARITABLE CAUSES</u> Approval was given for donations to be made to a number of charitable causes which have local impact

TREES ON ORCHARD CLOSE Approval was given for work to be undertaken on trees in Orchard Close

SPEEDWATCH UP AND RUNNING AGAIN!

Your Speedwatch volunteers were operating again last week following maintenance checks on the equipment.

All drivers were behaving themselves travelling North during early morning checks on Main Street

A one hour early afternoon check on Longworth Road on vehicles travelling South highlighted 4 speeding at 34 mph or more.

For the first time checks were planned for a Saturday morning but had to be cancelled due to bad weather.

REMEMBER the focus is on education, the checks are carried out well within the 30 mph signs and we operate fully visibleso there is no excuse.

Meanwhile in nearby East Hanney over 30 vehicles were found to be travelling at 34mph or above in a one hour check. The police have followed this up with a formal check which would also include checks that drivers were complying with other legislation.

She will be greatly missed by us all.



MEDIEVAL GRAFFITI

This is a picture of scratch marking graffiti in St Peter's Church.



It is a ritual protection mark, known as a hexfoil, and they crop up in many churches and elsewhere. The circular floral designs, turn out to be the most common motif. Ours is a particularly nice example and has now been added to the Medieval Graffiti Database by Matthew Champion who is a national expert on this subject. MESSAGE FROM YOUR COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILS

RAISING THE BAR IN RECYCLING: YOUR CHANCE TO TALK RUBBISH AND RECYCLING WITH OXFORDSHIRE'S COUNCILS

Do you know that each household in Oxfordshire produces one tonne of waste each year? Oxfordshire has been amongst the best in the country at recycling and composting for a few years now at about 60% but recycling rates have started to drop.

Residents are being given the chance to talk rubbish and recycling and tell Oxfordshire's councils how they can help them recycle more and create less waste.

This consultation will inform the review of the joint countywide waste strategy. This sets out shared priorities across Oxfordshire for waste and recycling until 2030 that will be approved by the Oxfordshire Environment Partnership over the summer. Then, each council partner will adopt changes later in the year.

We want to do better at recycling and the new joint countywide waste strategy is critical to this. We know that on average over half of the items put in the general waste bin could have been recycled by placing them in the other bins available.

Through this consultation residents are being asked what would help them to reduce their overall waste consumption and recycle more. This includes expanding the range of materials that can be recycled at the kerbside and tips and advice on left-over food, upcycling clothing or donating or buying second hand goods. The councils are also seeking views on more radical schemes that have been implemented elsewhere in the country, such as changing bin sizes and collection frequency.

Do you want to help us recycle and reduce waste? Take part in the online survey at www.recycleforoxfordshire.org.uk. The survey runs for six weeks until 18 February.
